Denver East's Joe Capra is the CHSAA Class 5A Player of the Year

Denver East junior defenseman Joe Capra (7) was named CHSAA Class 5A Player of the Year after helping lead the Angels to the CHSAA state title. He finished the season with a team-best 23 goals and tied for the lead with 46 points in the regular season. He added a goal and three assists in the state tournament to bring his season totals to 24 goals, 26 assists and 50 points.

For the Colorado High School Activities Association Class 5A Player of the Year, hockey isn't his top sports priority.

"I take football a lot more seriously, I'd say," junior Joe Capra said. "Hockey I really kind of do just play for fun. And I just had a fluke year, almost, where I just felt unstoppable."

He felt particularly unstoppable during a five-game stretch in late January to early February when he scored 11 goals and 19 points, scoring four points in four consecutive games. In all, the defenseman led Denver East with 23 goals and tied for the lead with 46 points in the regular season. He added a goal and three assists in the state tournament, helping the Angels become the first Denver-area public school to win a CHSAA state title.

Capra is also the quarterback of the Denver South football team, and he runs track and field in the spring. He doesn't get much of a gap in between football and hockey season. Once football is 100 percent complete in the fall, he'll grab his hockey bag and join his hockey teammates, who've already played the fall season together.

It takes Capra, who is listed on his Twitter account at at 6-foot-2, 172 pounds, about one practice on the ice and he's ready to go, according to Denver East hockey coach John Kopperud.

Capra has always been a solid hockey player, a speedy playmaker who's responsible with the puck, though Kopperud has seen his strength improve over the years, something that translates from football.

"It's a bummer that he plays football for us hockey people because he could have a real future in hockey," Kopperud said. "But it's a hobby for him. And he's such a good athlete that he gets away with it."



Capra models his game after a particular Avalanche player, saying he is the Cale Makar of Colorado high school hockey — an offensive-minded defenseman.

Capra's confidence and poise with the puck is also extremely high, according to Kopperud. He takes chances with the puck and can get away with it because of his speed and athletic ability, the coach added. Capra idolizes his game around a certain Colorado Avalanche star.

"I'd like to say I'm the Cale Makar of Colorado high school hockey," Capra said. "Because I'm really offensive when I play, even though I'm a D-man. I'm still going to try and score as many goals as possible."

Valor Christian coach George Gwozdecky's team faced Capra twice this season, in a 3-2 December loss and the state title game. The coach noticed Capra's decision-making abilities, his speed allowing him to beat opposing players on the ice and solid passing skills.

"When you combine that with his size and his overall ability to be able to move and laterally move up and down, he was a real value to their roster and certainly played a huge role in Denver East winning a state title," Gwozdecky said.

As the team's No. 1 defenseman, Capra runs the power play, a fitting spot for a guy who's also a quarterback. Gwozdecky certainly noticed the skillset Capra brought as a quarterback, whether it was on the power play or even strength. He's a player who can be a difference maker no matter what sport he plays, Gwozdecky said.

"He's just very dynamic with what he does and how he sees the ice and moves the puck," Kopperud said. "Its unprecedented where a defenseman leads your team in goal scoring."

But it's not just the power play where Capra sees his skills between sports transfer. When he has the puck in the back, it's exactly like having the football in the pocket with teammates getting open and cutting through zones.

He was the "straw that stirred the drink," Gwozdecky said.

"He was the guy that when things were going a little bit crazy and there was a lot of pressure, he'd get the puck on his stick, he'd slow things down, he'd make good decisions," Gwozdecky said.

Capra saw the potential success for his hockey team in the fall when the team was in the CPHL championship without him while he finished up the season on the football field. Winning the state title with a 6-3 victory over Christian Valor was "the cherry on top" to the season, Capra said. He added a goal and an assist in that title game.

"I didn't stop smiling for about two straight weeks," Capra said. "It was just the best feeling in the world."
